"Starburst Grants" to Chapters, 2022-2025



Goals:

- To help chapters increase public awareness of DAR and its mission within their local communities through historical, educational, and patriotic activities/events.
- To build stronger relationships within the local communities in preparation for the anticipated America 250! membership growth.
- To engage the chapter's membership in the historical, educational, and patriotic activities/events.

Program:

- 1. Chapters will be provided grants to support chapter activities/events in the local community.
- 2. Funding for this program will come from the 2022-2025 State Regent's Project.
- 3. Annually on December 31, 15% of the funds raised by the State Regent's Project during the year will be set aside for financial grants for approved chapter proposals.
- 4. A chapter may receive only one grant during the Nesbitt Administration (2022-2025).

Process:

- 1. Chapters may apply for a grant by submitting a grant proposal to the State Projects/Grants chair. Deadline for receipt of proposals is December 31. The State Projects/Grants chair will forward all proposals received to the State Executive Committee by January 5.
- 2. The State Executive Committee will review all proposals submitted and make funding decisions based on the viability of each proposal, projected impact/benefit of the activity, amount of funds available, and total number of proposals received.
- 3. All chapters submitting proposals will be notified of grants being made or declined not later than March 1.
- 4. Chapters receiving grants must complete the activity within one year of receipt of funds.
- 5. A final report summarizing the activity/event must be sent to the State Projects/Grants chair within one year of receiving the grant. Include a description of chapter member involvement in the activity/event and how community awareness of DAR changed after the activity/event.

Proposals:

- 1. The proposed activity/event must be historical, educational, or patriotic in nature.
- 2. Describe how chapter members will be involved in the activity/event.
- 3. Describe how the general community will benefit and how their perception of DAR will change.
- 4. The chapter must agree to provide a final report as described above by the stated deadline.
- 5. Deadline for receipt of proposals is December 31.
